Dear Parents and Carers,

It has certainly been a cold week, although this does not seem to have bothered the children who have been very busy in both their playing and learning. I am not sure the staff on playground duty have been so impressed!

On Thursday Forge class led us in a worship about friendship in the wider world. I was impressed with how clearly and how well they read, they had some difficult words to read but all managed very well. They reminded the whole school about the message of being kind to others and how to be a good friend.



Today some of our year 5 and 6 children have represented the school in the Mini Youth Games Swimming Competition. We also had a very brave year 4 child, Mia Jones, join them. Well done to all the children who trialled for the competition, it is a tricky one as we really do have to pick our most confident swimmers. It is a very competitive competition and we need to ensure our children can safely swim at least 2 legal strokes to be able to take part. Mr Peters reported there were issues with the starting beep being too quiet which affected some of our swimmers, especially as we were in the first heat when the issue was noticed. We are keeping our fingers crossed that they have had a great time, it is always a great atmosphere, with the children all cheering on the rest of their team.

Also today, Lily Avis, in Forge Class, has inspired year 6 with her gymnastics skills. She joined their PE lesson to show them how to put a routine together. Well done Lily!



Our school council met this week. We discussed a manner of things including lunchtime equipment and how they are all enjoying playing with the new equipment, although the school council were disappointed to see some children just leaving it on the field or wherever they have been playing with it for someone else to tidy away. They also talked about lunchtime in the hall and how the children are sitting - we will be looking at alternatives to how they are seated so they are not split apart from their friends when the hall is busy. We also discussed bullying and the anti-bullying survey we carry out annually with the children. The school council children said they do not feel that children always know what bullying actually is. Therefore they have decided to lead a worship about it, explaining the difference between being unkind or having a falling out with a friend and actual bullying. They were very grown up and thoughtful in their discussions around this sensitive topic.





Elliott Shepherd reminded me that St. David's house did not get a Tag day for being the wining house last term. Their Tag Day, when they can wear their own clothes into school, with yellow item is: Monday 22nd January -sorry that we forgot about you St. David's house! St. George's house is currently the wining house for term 3, with an 82 point lead!
